Use creative Commons work You can find them, e.g., here: https://search. creativecommons.org/ → Please note: Content under a free license may be free of charge, but information about the author is still generally required. More information: https://creativecommons.org/licenses/?lang=de/

Always ask the author if you want to use materials without a Creative Commons license.

Use photographs, graphics, or drawings you made yourselves

→ Please note: Observe a person's right to their own image and do not show any protected brands, designs, or private property.

Use official logos, images, and video material of the company you are analyzing. Prerequisite: The company owns the copyright to the material.

TIP: Ideally, indicate all license information directly at the lower edge of the video. Of course, you don't need to indicate your own material.

Don't violate copyright: Images, videos, music, GIFs, etc. (also emojis, maps, elements from television shows, etc.) are copyright-protected. You may not use them without permission from the copyright holder.

Don't violate the right to one's own image.

If people are recognizable in images, drawings, videos, etc. they must have agreed to the use of their image. Also take care when using pictures of celebrities!

Don't use purchased music. Purchasing a song does not authorize you to use it in a video.

Don't film in a building or on a company's premises without a permit.
