Project days

Teachers define project days with the b@s videochallenge, using the provided materials, such as a work plan and downloadable files.

Business classes

Teachers integrate the b@s videochallenge in their classes, usually starting with theory and saving the video competition for use as the final project.

English classes

Teachers use the possibility to do the b@s videochallenge in English to help students practice their language and communication skills.

Career orientation

Teachers use the video competition to encourage students to discover their own interests, strengths, and weaknesses and to give them a look at how business and companies work.
